Introduction:

National Service Scheme (NSS) is good opportunity before the students and the teachers to learn their social responsibility. It is the duty of students and teachers to serve the best for the development of the society particularly villagers so that their life might be raised to the higher level of morality and piece.

NSS helps the students to develop appreciation to other person's point of view and also show consideration to /other living beings.
